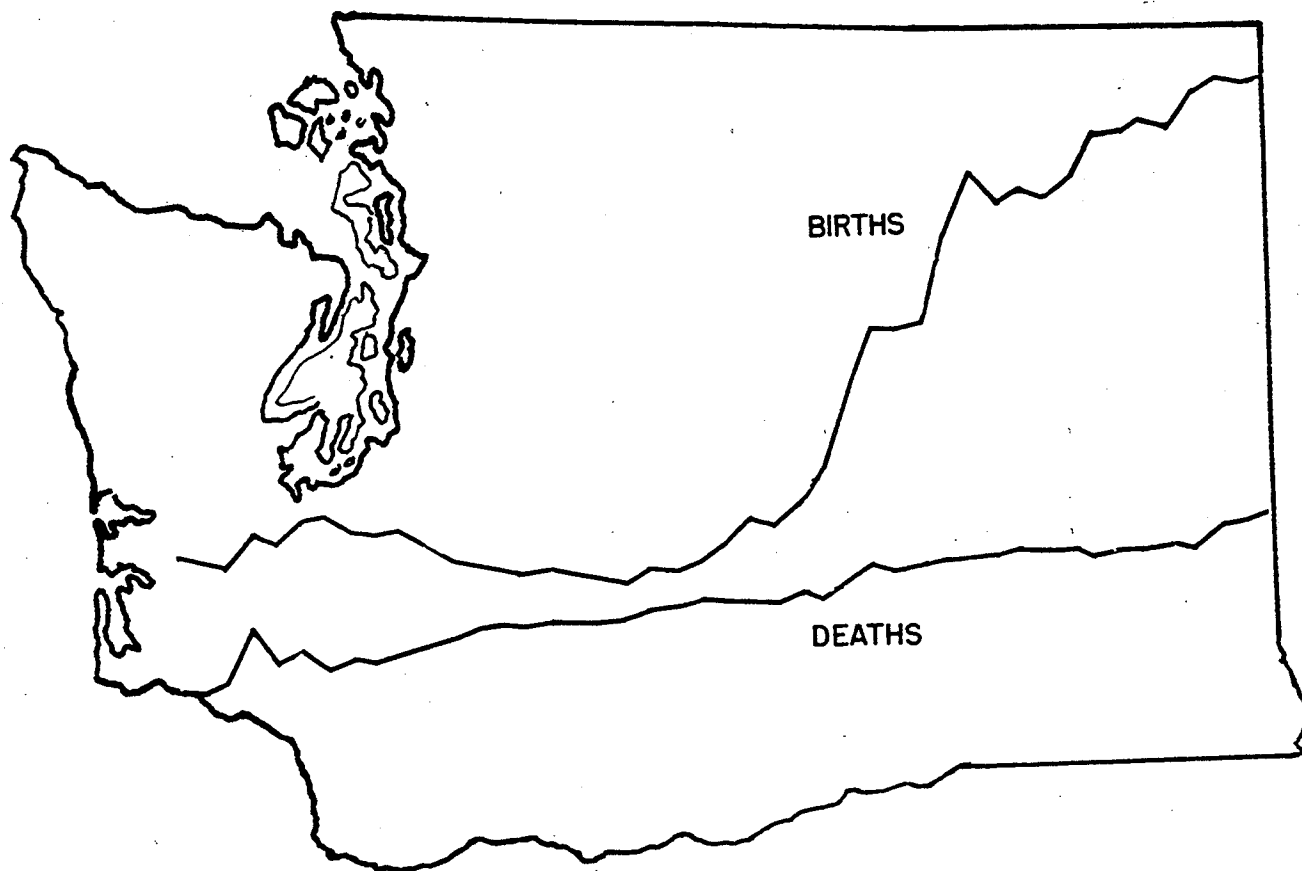



INTRODUCTION

This report presents data on livebirths, deaths, fetal deaths (stillbirths) for the calendar year 1959 and the estimated population for the State of Washington as of July 1, 1959. Most data are reported for the state as a whole, each county and each city of 10,000 population or more.

Vital statistics data included in this report are identified either as residence data or occurrence data. Residence data refer to vital events involving residents of the area regardless of where the vital events actually occurred. Occurrence data refer to vital events actually occurring in the area regardless of the place of residence of the person or persons involved. In general, data presented on a residence basis are more useful.

Appendix tables contain tuberculosis morbidity data, marriage and divorce data for the calendar year 1959.

Certain additional data including data for cities of 2,500 to 10,000 population in 1950 are available in unpublished form in the files of the Public Health Statistics Section.

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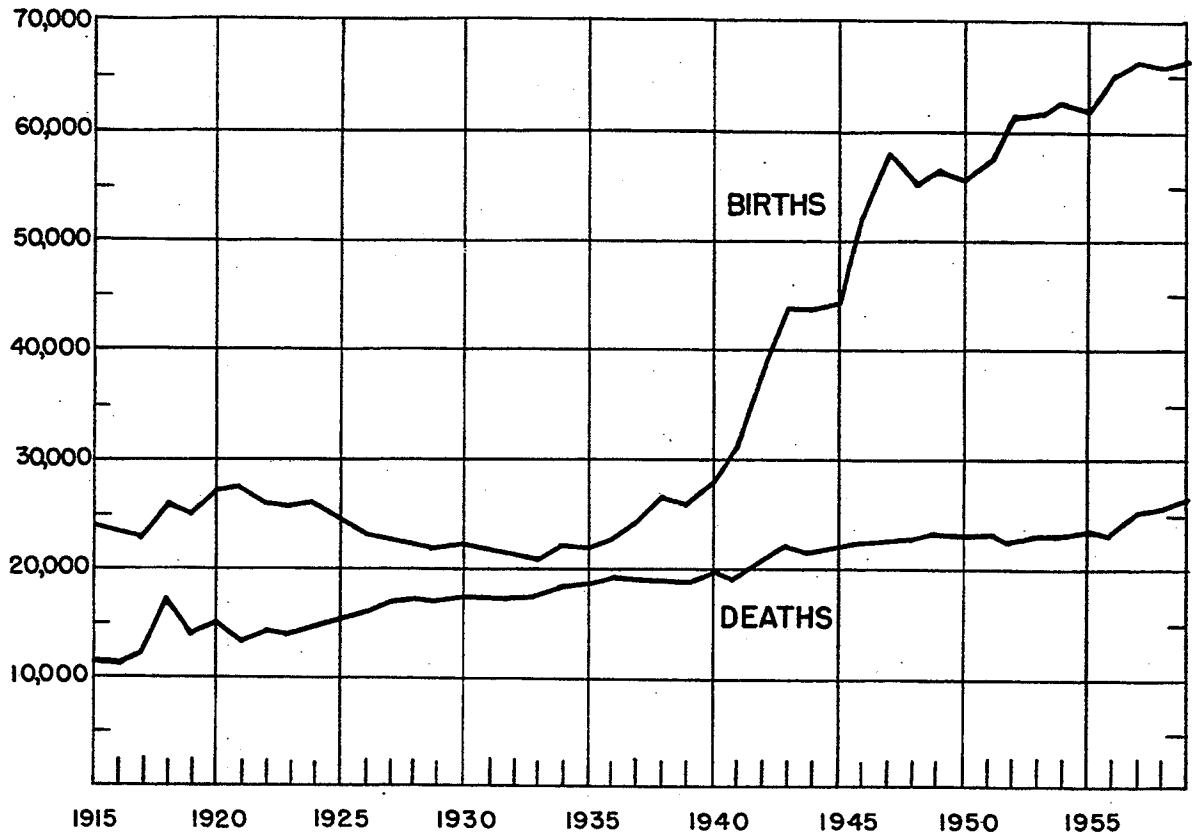
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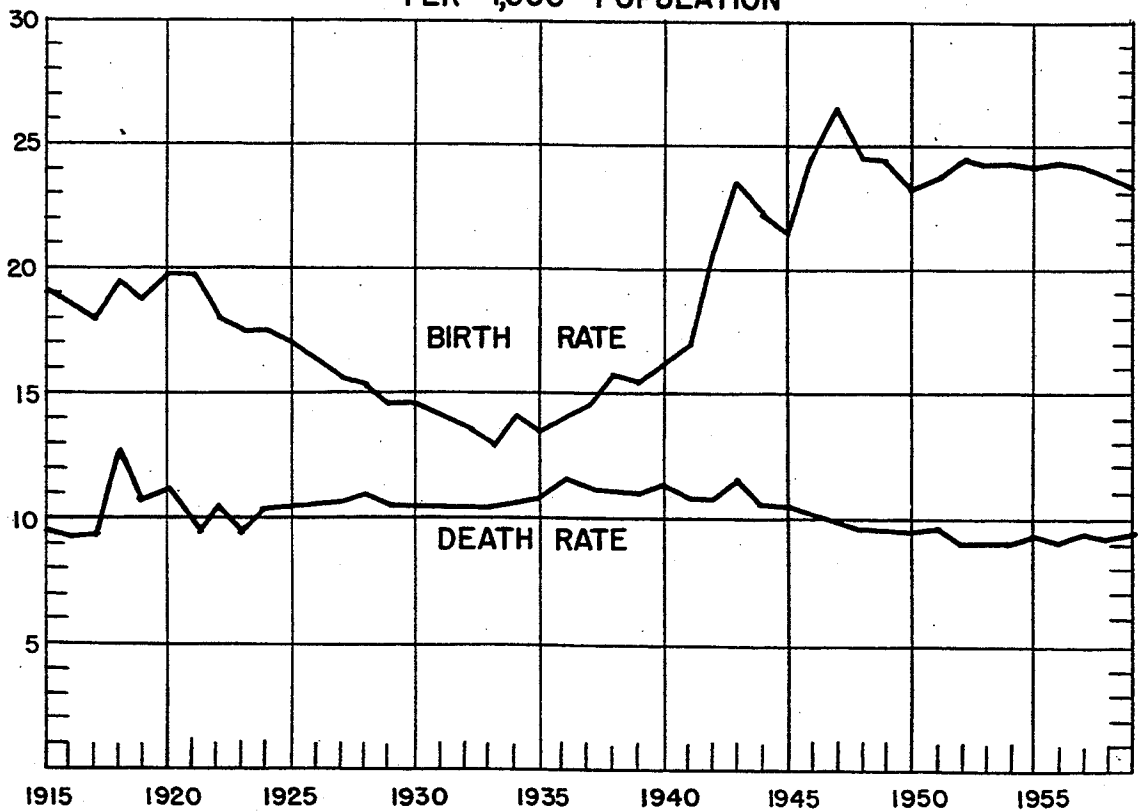
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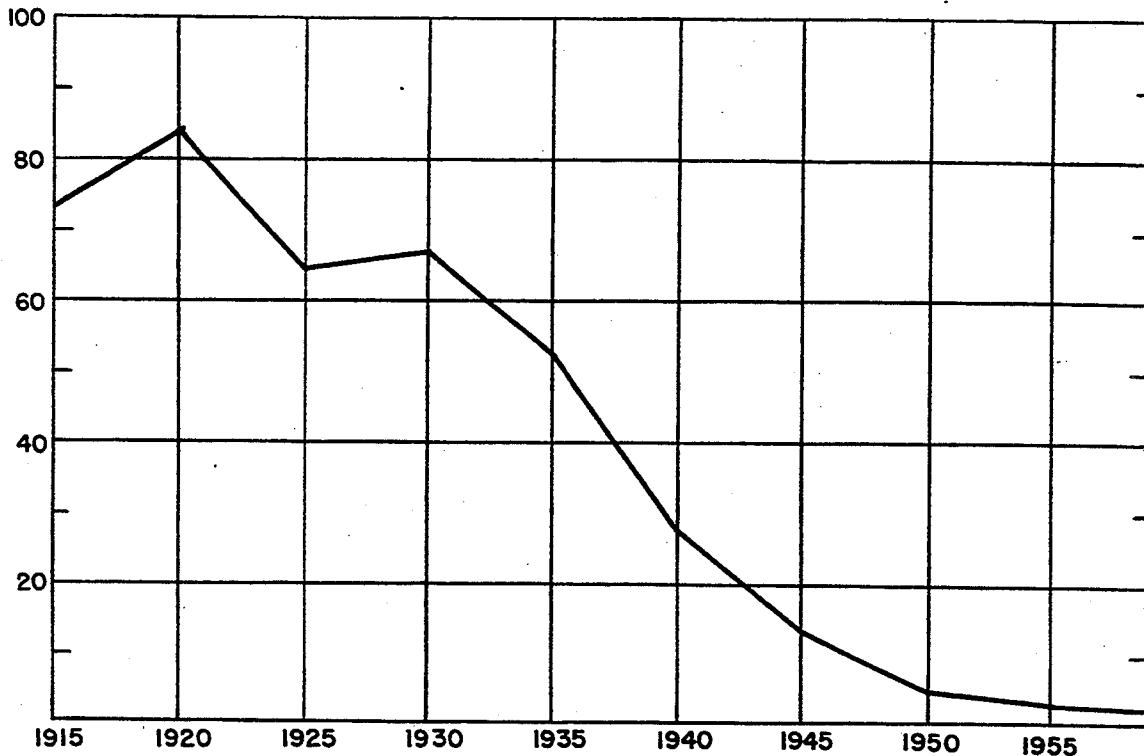
BIRTHS AND DEATHS, 1915 - 1959

INFANT AND FETAL DEATH RATES, 1915 - 1959
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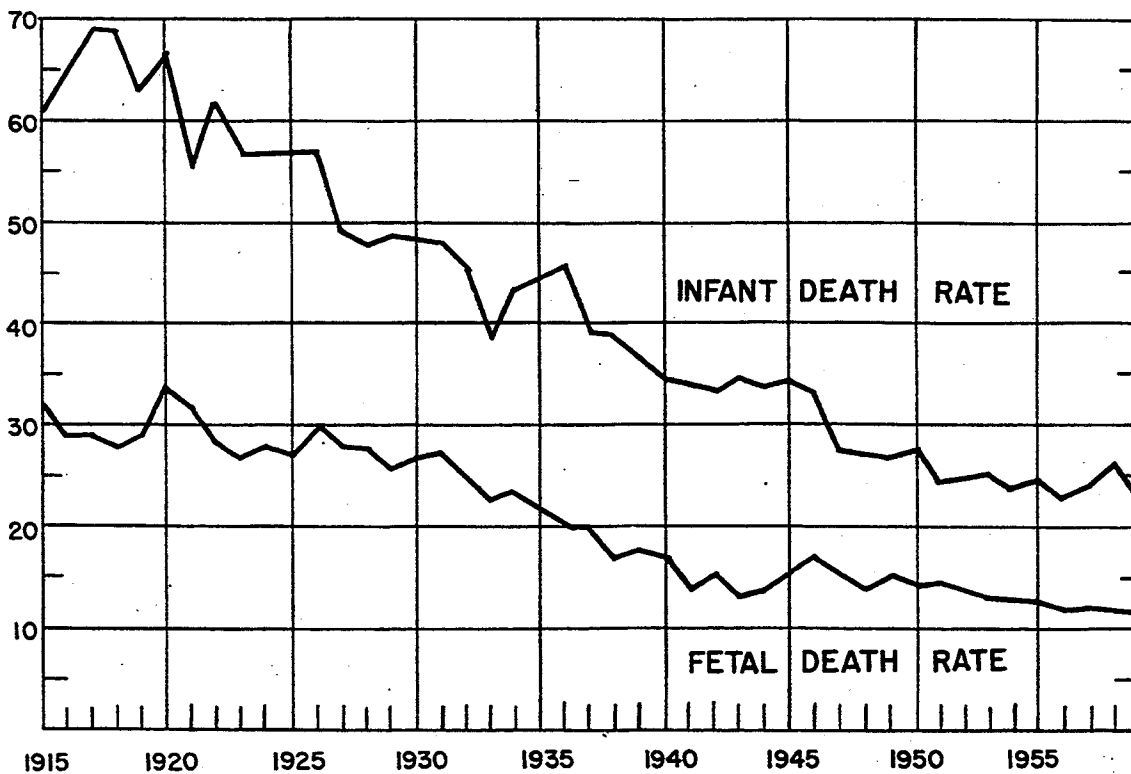

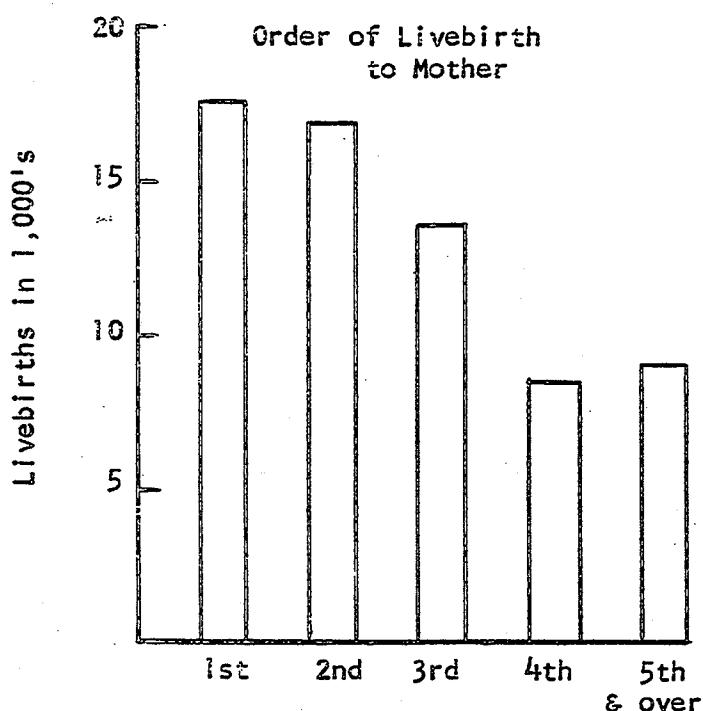
LIVEBIRTHS

The number of livebirths in Washington in 1959 was the second largest in the state's history with 66,044 births occurring in the state and 65,729 births to Washington residents. The resident birth rate for 1959 is 23.3, slightly below the ten year median of 24.2.

Table 2 lists the number of births from 1915 through 1959 with rates per 1,000 estimated population. These data are presented graphically on page IX. It can be observed in general the trend has been upward although a temporary downward trend prevailed during the period from 1920 through 1933. In 1933, the low rate of 12.9 per 1,000 population prevailed. From this point, a gradual rising trend is observed which continues until the peak is reached in 1947. From 1947 to date, the birth rate seems to have tapered off to a norm of around 24 livebirths per 1,000 estimated population.

Counties showing the highest resident birth rates for 1959 (all those over 28.0 per 1,000 population) were Grant with 29.0 per 1,000, Island with 32.2 per 1,000. Those counties showing the lowest resident birth rates (all those under 16.0 per 1,000 population) were Columbia with 13.5 per 1,000, San Juan with 11.6 per 1,000 and Wahkiakum with 15.4 per 1,000. Residence and occurrence births for 1959 with rates per 1,000 population are given in Table 4 on page 7 of this summary.

Of the total residence livebirths 94.3 per cent were classified as White with 2.6 per cent as Negro, 1.5 per cent as Indian and the balance as Oriental or Other. This is a slight gain in the percentage of non-white livebirths from 3.5% in 1950 to 5.7% in 1959. County data by race are given in Table 5 on page 9.



Of the livebirths by residence 99.0 per cent were born in hospitals or maternity homes. Residence and occurrence data by place, institutions of birth, are given in Table 7 page 13.

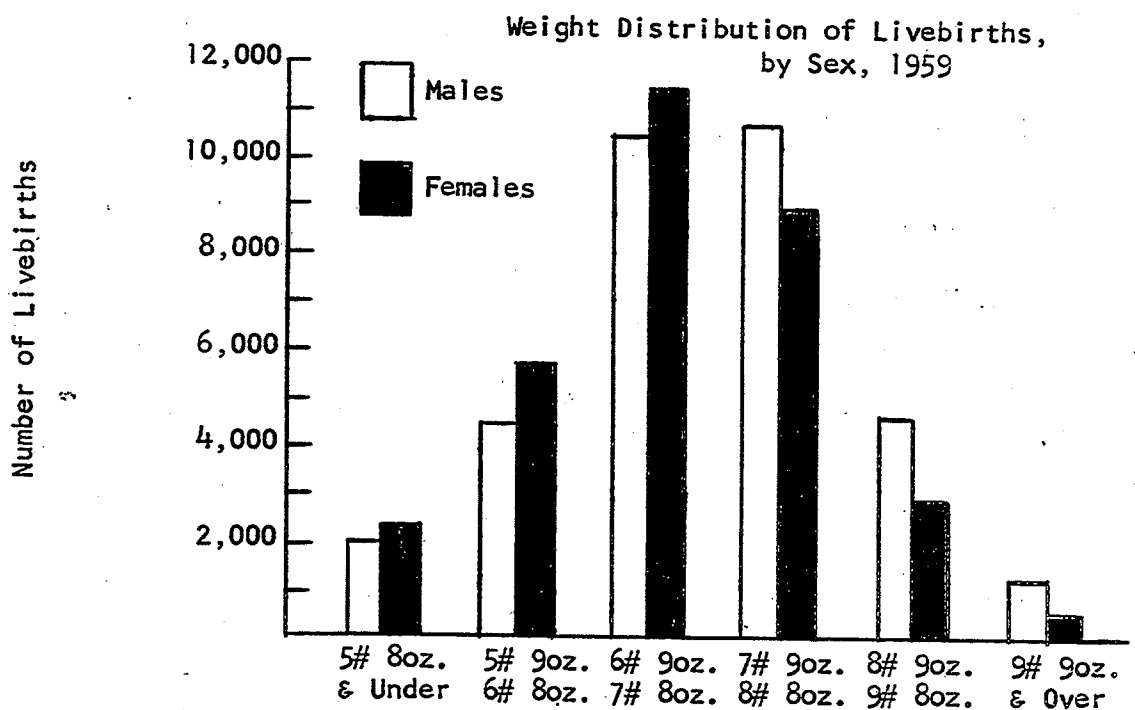
The sex ratio of residence livebirths was 105.5 males per every 100 females. In regard to the order of birth, more livebirths were the first child of the family than were the second or third. Of the residence livebirths, 26.8% were the first child in the family, 25.7% the second child and 20.7% the third child born to the family. The order of livebirth to mother is illustrated in the graph on this page and is presented in tabulated form in the birth summary table on page 5.

A total of 687 sets of twins were born in 1959. Of these, 662 sets of twins were born in which both were liveborn and 25 sets with one child listed as a fetal death.

In addition to these, seven sets of triplets were born. All infants in this group were liveborn. The county and city breakdown of multiple births is given in Table 9 page 17. Median age of mothers in 1959 was 25 years of age. The greatest number of births occurred to mothers in the 20-24 age group.

Resident illegitimate livebirths occurred at the rate of 29.4 per 1,000 resident livebirths and of occurrence illegitimate livebirths occurred at the rate of 30.0 per 1,000 occurrence livebirths. Table 9, page 17, contains data on illegitimate livebirths by county and city of residence and of occurrence.

Median weight of the males was 7 pounds 9 ounces as compared to 7 pounds 4 ounces for the female livebirths.



The above graph shows the weight distribution by sex. Defining immaturity as infants 5 1/2 pounds or less at birth, there were 4,346 immature livebirths or 6.6 per cent of the total number of residence livebirths. Tables 9, 10 and 11 on pages 17, 19, and 21 give the data on immaturity by county and city.

Pages 5 through 27 contain other data on livebirths for Washington during the year 1959.

MORTALITY

General

There were 26,229 deaths of Washington residents in 1959 for a rate of 9.3 per 1,000 estimated population. Deaths occurred in Washington at a rate of 9.4 per 1,000 estimated population for a total number of deaths occurring of 26,454. Pacific County had the highest residence death rate with a rate of 14.1 per 1,000 population. The lowest death rate was shown by Benton and Grant Counties with the rate of 4.8 per 1,000 population.

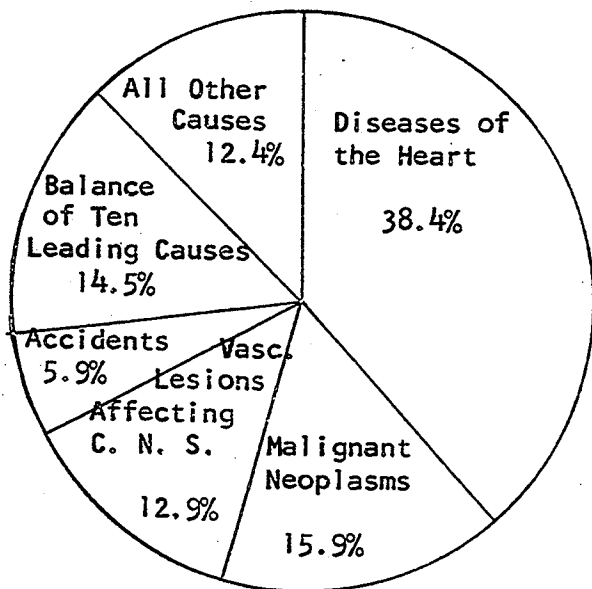
The sex ratio for residence deaths in 1959 was 150.6 male deaths for every 100 female deaths. Of the male deaths 53.8 per cent were married at the time of death and only 17.1 were widowers. Female deaths included 33.7 per cent married women and 49.5 per cent widowed. Median age of males dying was 68 and the median age at death of females was 73. The white race accounted for 96.9 per cent of the total number of deaths.

General mortality data are given in death summary Tables 15, 16 and 17, pages 30 through 36 and Tables 18 through 28 contain more detailed data.

Selected Causes

Table 16, page 32 gives selected causes of death arranged according to the cause of death code as determined by the International Statistical

Classification of Causes of Death. The death summary Table also lists the ten leading causes of death according to rank. Diseases of the heart accounted for 38.4 per cent of the total number of deaths of the State residents in 1959 with a rate of 357.1 per 100,000 population. Diseases of the heart has been the leading cause of death in Washington since 1913 with the exception of pneumonia in 1918.

Tuberculosis was a leading cause of death before 1913, but since 1952 tuberculosis no longer ranked as one of the ten leading causes. Malignant neoplasms and vascular lesions affecting the central nervous system have been the second and third leading causes of death since the early 1920's.

MORTALITY (Cont'd)

The fourth leading cause "All Accidents" was the leading cause of death at ages 1 through 34. Diseases of early infancy were the leading cause of death at age under 1 year. Table 17, page 34 lists the leading causes of death in each five year age group for each sex with a percentage that each comprises of the total in each age group.

Causes of death of special interest, though not necessarily leading causes are given by county and city with rates per 100,000 population in Table 23, pages 47 to 52.

Deaths from infective and parasitic diseases, including tuberculosis, are given in Table 27, page 61.

Accidental deaths by leading causes, and by place of accident are given in Table 24, page 53.

Homicides and Suicides by county and city of residence and occurrence are given in Table 26, page 59.

There were 8 maternal deaths in Washington in 1959. Data on maternal deaths are given in Table 28, pages 63 and 64.

FETAL DEATHS
(Stillbirths)

For purposes of Washington State vital statistics registration, a fetal death is defined as a delivery after at least twenty weeks of gestation in which the fetus shows no evidence of life. There are indications that a number of fetal deaths within the scope of this definition are not registered.

A total of 749 residence fetal deaths were recorded in 1959 for a ratio of 11.4 fetal deaths for each 1,000 residence livebirths. During 1959, 761 fetal deaths occurred in the State of Washington or a ratio of 11.5 per 1,000 occurrence livebirths. These ratios continue the long term downward trend. (See graph on page X)

Among the causes of fetal death, placental and cord conditions accounted for 44.5 per cent of all residence fetal deaths. Table 30 on page 68 gives further data on residence fetal death by causes.

There were 132.0 male fetal deaths for each 100 female fetal deaths. Fetal deaths by county and city of residence and by county and city of occurrence with ratio per 1,000 livebirths are given in Tables 31 and 32 on pages 69 and 71.

INFANT DEATHS

Infant deaths (deaths of infants under one year of age) accounted for 1,570 or 6.0% of the total number of residence deaths in 1959. As can be seen in the graph on page X, the infant mortality rate has experienced a downward trend since 1915. The 1959 residence infant death rate of 23.9 per 1,000 livebirths extends this trend, as it is the lowest rate since the 1956 rate of 23.4 per 1,000.

Of residence infant deaths in 1959, there was a ratio of 149.2 male deaths for every 100 female deaths. In 1958, this ratio was 143.6 males to every 100 females. This represents a male infant death rate for 1959 of 27.9 deaths per 1,000 male livebirths and a female infant death rate of 19.7 per 1,000 female livebirths.

In 1959, 964 or 61.4% of the infant deaths were classified in the grouping "Certain Diseases of Early Infancy". Of this group, immaturity mentioned with some other condition and immaturity unqualified accounted for 699 deaths. Immaturity or some other condition with mention of immaturity accounted for 44.5 per cent of all infant deaths. Congenital malformations accounted for 16.4 per cent of the infant deaths followed by influenza and pneumonia which caused 11.0 percent of the infant deaths (not including pneumonia of the newborn which is included in category "Certain diseases of Early Infancy"). Accidents caused 3.3 per cent of the infant deaths.

Indians again showed the highest infant death rate 52.5 per 1,000 livebirths. The graph below shows infant death rates by race. Table 34, page 75, gives infant deaths by race by county and city of residence.

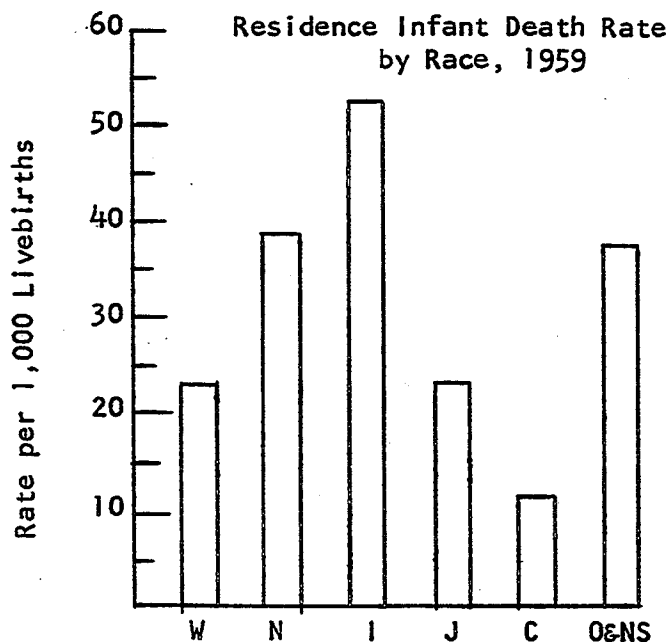


Table 35, page 77, gives a detailed breakdown of infant deaths by cause, sex and age of infant. Table 33, page 73, lists the leading causes for the counties and major cities.

Neonatal Deaths

Neonatal deaths (infants who died before reaching the age of 28 days) accounted for 73.4% of the total resident infant deaths for 1959. Neonatal death data by county and city of residence and by county and city of occurrence are given in Tables 31 and 32, pages 69 and 71.
