

# Does Your Pharmacy Offer No-Cost COVID-19 Vaccines?



Learn about options to improve access to COVID-19 vaccines for uninsured or underinsured patients.

## eTrueNorth and the Bridge Access Program

Through the federal Bridge Access Program, pharmacies enrolled with eTrueNorth, can administer no-cost COVID-19 vaccines to uninsured and underinsured adults, ages 18 and older.

- No-cost COVID-19 vaccines will be available until December 31, 2024, or while supplies last.
- All pharmacies are encouraged to enroll, including community pharmacies and those affiliated with health systems, clinics, correctional facilities, and long-term care facilities.
- Pharmacies can submit monthly reimbursement for vaccine product and \$45/person vaccine administration fees.

## Childhood Vaccine Program (CVP)

This WA State Department of Health (DOH) program supplies childhood vaccines at no cost to providers or patients regardless of insurance status.

- All vaccines recommended by the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) are supplied for patients, under age 19.
- Eliminates the need for providers to keep separate stock of vaccines for privately insured children.

## Adult Vaccine Program (AVP)

This DOH program provides select no-cost vaccines for uninsured adults, ages 19 years and up.

- Subject to federal funding, selected vaccines are available for providers to order at no cost, twice a year.
- The vaccines change from year to year. In 2023-24, COVID-19, flu, and several other vaccinations are available to order!
