Booster Pump Station and Well 7 Improvements Project

In 2016, the City of Selah used a Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF) loan to replace an old booster pump station and improve Well 7. The existing booster pump station was below ground, unsafe, and difficult to access for maintenance; it could not deliver a reliable, adequate water flow to the distribution system.

The city replaced the booster pump station with a new facility that is safe and easy to access for maintenance, and able to provide adequate flow to the distribution system. The city also installed several improvements at Well 7, including chlorination, upgraded controls, and a variable-frequency drive pump and motor to better meet system demands. These improvements made this source more reliable and resilient.

We awarded a \$1,222,100 DWSRF construction loan to the City of Selah.

Public health and environmental benefits

The City of Selah can provide safe and reliable drinking water with the new booster pump station. The improvements to the well allow the city to better meet system demands.
